In Memoriam

Dr. Omar Pasalodos, a beloved, longtime member of the Baptist Health family, was a highly regarded physician leader, a dedicated philanthropist and a devoted husband and father. As an obstetrician-gynecologist and civic leader, Dr. Pasalodos dedicated his career to caring for his patients, education and advocacy, and his volunteer leadership. He exemplified the best in medicine.

As a member of the medical staff at Baptist Hospital, Dr. Pasalodos served on the Medical

Board and as chief of obstetrics and gynecology. At the time of his death, he was chief medical officer for Baptist Health's International Division. Among his community and philanthropic work, he was chairman of Florida International University's Herbert Wertheim College of Medicine's Dean's Advisory Council. In addition, he was a director of Doctors Hospital Foundation and a member of the Baptist Health International Advisory Board, Coral Gables War Memorial Youth Center, Health Foundation of South Florida, Miami Obstetrical and Gynecological Society and the William A. Little Society of University of Miami Alumni.
