## POLICY STATEMENT

Narrative assessment of student performance – including assessment of noncognitive achievement when applicable – must be included in each required course and clerkship in which sufficient teacher-student interaction occurs to allow such assessment to be provided.

## SCOPE

This policy applies to students in the MD Program.

# **REASON FOR POLICY**

This policy covers narrative assessment of student performance.

DEFINITIONS			
TERM	DEFINITIONS		
Narrative assessment	Narrative assessment is defined as written comments from faculty that assess student performance and achievement in meeting the objectives of a course or clerkship.		
Sufficient teacher-student interaction	Sufficient teacher-student interaction is defined as interaction in a small group of students less than 12 with at least 4 interactions with the same faculty member.
