It lacks the writer's current role as a clinical teacher and qualifications for writing this letter, specifically, her experience as a clinical teacher (how long and in what ways she's been a clinical teacher), and detail about what capacity the letter writer has known the student.

The letter lists duties expected of any student, but is vague and does not give specific, accurate details about skills or attitudes, communicating that the letter writer knew the student well. There is also no comment on the quality of the student's work.

The writer does note that the student gave excellent presentations, but does not explain how the presentations were excellent.

There is no statement offering a comparison of this student to his peers.

There is no statement of whether this candidate would be ideal for the writer's own residency program.

There are grammatical errors.

There is no handwritten signature.

The signature line does not include the faculty member's appointment.
